 <p>AP CollegeBoard Advanced Placement Program</p>	<p><b>Advanced Placement (AP)</b> courses offer a rigorous educational experience for college-bound students. AP courses last a full school year. In May, AP exams are taken and scored on a 5-point scale. Most major colleges and universities recognize scores of 3 or higher for college credit. The amount of credit and type of credit vary by institution. Immanuel currently offers a variety of AP courses: <i>AP Biology</i>, <i>AP World History</i>, and <i>AP US History</i>.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 10th, 11th, and 12th-grade students.</li> <li>• Meet course-specific prerequisites.  <p>COLORADO CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY Grace and Truth</p>	<p><b>Colorado Christian University (CCU)</b> Immanuel has partnered with CCU to offer on-campus dual credit (DC) and online dual enrollment (ODE) courses. Courses are 1 to 2 semesters in length. High school students who successfully complete the courses earn transferable general education (GE) credits in addition to high school credits. Immanuel currently offers two DC courses: Pre-Calculus &amp; Calculus.  <p>GRAND CANYON UNIVERSITY</p>	<p><b>Grand Canyon University (GCU)</b> offers a variety of online dual enrollment (ODE) courses that are available to high school students. Courses vary in length and have rolling admissions. Due to the intensity of these courses, students can expect to invest a significant amount of time in assignments, readings, etc. It may be an ideal summer option. **DC & ODE/DE Important Considerations:**

1. Grades earned for DC or ODE/DE will be permanently posted on the student's High School and college transcripts. Students who fail a DC or ODE/DE course may jeopardize their eligibility for scholarships or financial aid after high school.
2. It is recommended that students contact their institutions of interest to find out how course credits will transfer, as each institution has varying guidelines depending on students' majors and other factors.
