



# Options and opportunities for Summer School

(Credit Recovery, Original and/or Dual Credit)

Summer school opportunities for Immanuel High School students range in cost and purposes from credit recovery, original credits, and dual credits. Immanuel students, through outside institutions, have the ability to: 1) Recover credits for failed high school courses in order to meet high school graduation requirements. 2) Earn original credits for high school requirements to allow for a more flexible course schedule that upcoming school year, or to simply enrich the student's learning. 3) Earn dual credits by taking transferable college-level courses that count towards high school graduation credit requirements and allow them the opportunity to move ahead in gaining college credits as well as freeing up their course schedule for the following school year. **Communication with our counseling department is required for all summer schooling options.**

	<p><b>Community College Enrichment Program (a.k.a. High School Enrichment or HSE)</b> Immanuel works with a variety of community colleges, including Reedley College, College of the Sequoias, and West Hills, to provide students with the opportunity to enroll in college courses and receive both college and high school credit. Evening and online courses are available. 	<p><b>Grand Canyon University</b> offers a variety of online dual-enrollment courses that are available to high school students. Courses are 7 weeks in length with 2-3 start dates each month, depending on the demand. Due to the intensity of these courses, students can expect to invest a significant amount of time in assignments, readings, etc. It may be an ideal summer option. 	<p><b>Colorado Christian University</b> offers a variety of online dual-enrollment courses that are available to high school students. Summer classes are 10 weeks; fall and spring classes are 15 weeks.</p>	<p>Approval from parents, counselor, and/or principal</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Tuition is \$100 per credit hour.</li> <li>Students must purchase textbooks and other required materials.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Meet with your high school counselor to determine eligibility and availability of courses.</li> <li>Register online via CCU's website. 	<p><b>Early College:</b> National University offers eligible students the opportunity to take college-level general education classes at a discounted tuition rate. <p><b>Online High Schools</b></p>	<p>There are a variety of online high schools offering summer courses for students who either need credit recovery or would like to get ahead. **VERY IMPORTANT:** Grades earned for dual enrollment or High School Enrichment courses will be permanently posted on student's High School and college transcripts. Students who fail DE or HSE courses may jeopardize financial aid possibilities for themselves in the future. It is highly recommended that students contact institutions of interest in order to find out how course credits will transfer, as institutions have varying guidelines for the transfer of credits- this can vary depending on the student's major, and many universities will accept courses within your major as elective credit.
